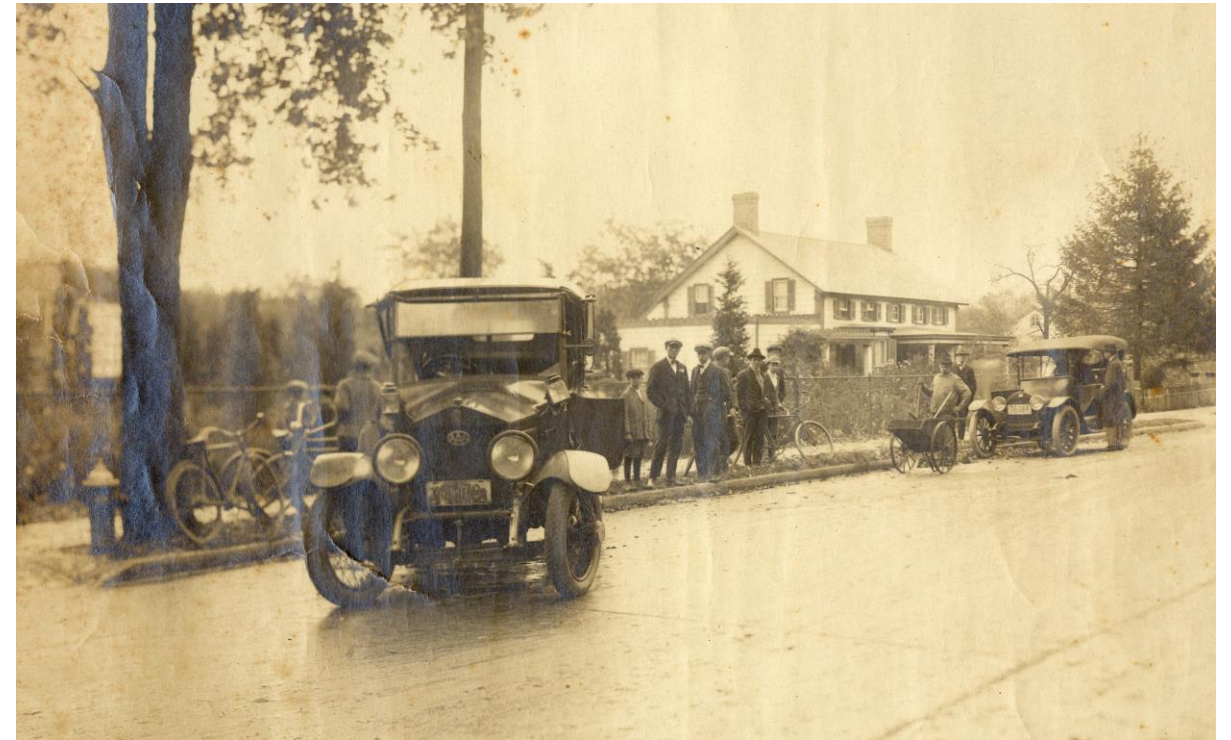

Since over 80 persons attended our first meeting, this affair will be purely social, rather than a business meeting, in order to provide more time for all to become acquainted.

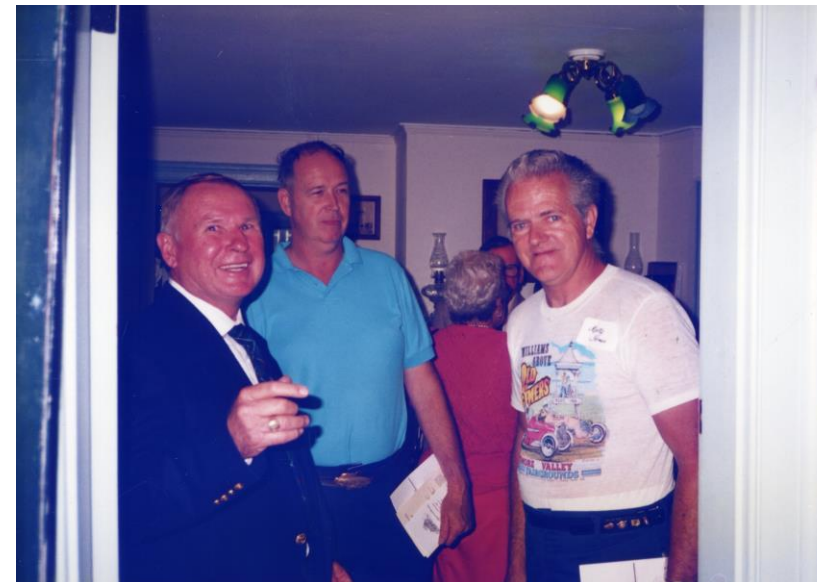
